### 'Working for You'

Safety First Community Training Centre, reg charity no. 1128555, believes that it is important to work with disadvantaged adults to increase their opportunities and benefit themselves and their families – we do this within our charitable objectives of;

- 1. Providing a focal point in the community where People can become involved in a range of activities including Education, Training, Recreation and Health projects.
- 2. To provide a response to particular problems identified by the Community and residents.



<u>Asylum seekers and refugees</u> There has been a large increase in the number in the number of unemployed adults attending the Centre, between 270 and 320 per week [this equates to between 13,500 and 16,000 adults over the year] Many of these are asylum seekers and refugees who access our food and clothing support and English [ESOL] classes. This year we have noticed an increase in Kurdish, Farsi and Arabic speakers and speakers of African languages and whilst we are fortunate to enjoy fantastically diverse communities, we still need to bring in additional resources to meet the needs of all of our service users.

**Wrap-around support** Bradford Council have seen the benefit of Safety First Community Training Centre and regularly refer people to us not only for our ESOL provision but for our energy support and food bank.
